It seems like as we get older, we're getting busier! As we face signing up for Medicare in 2024, we thought it was to be the other way around. We are nonetheless thankful to the Lord for our health and opportunity to still serve Him.

Fall was a busy time for us as Mark led a *baptism class* for two young adults and two older men. It was special to hear their testimonies of how God has been at work in their lives. Moreover, we continue to serve on the *Healing for the Nations* team under the leadership of missionary colleague, Nicolas Girard, who visited us twice this fall as we held this year's retreat at a Christian camp in our area. It was a pleasure to minister during this weekend in assisting others to be free in their walk with Christ.

In addition, we travelled north by car to Switzerland with Nicolas' wife, Leia, to attend a missionary retreat sponsored by *Time of Refreshing*. There we met over 40 European missionaries some young, but most older and seasoned. It was a blessing to hear their testimonies of God's faithfulness and protection: one family having miraculously survived the earthquake in Turkey and others who work with refugees exiting the Ukraine.

She and her husband have great attitudes while facing this trial.

In November, we were able to host Dr. David Boyd, a Canadian theologian/minister, who we met several years ago and has served in Jerusalem and Ukraine in Evangelical seminaries. He spent 10 days ministering in four area churches, teaching on the gathering of the

After seven weeks in the hospital, he was released with the assistance of a G-tube inserted in his tummy for daily feeding until he is able to swallow on his own. We trust the Lord he will lead a healthy life despite seizures he had early on.

As we look ahead to 2024, we continue to pray for the two nations we have a foot in and for the Gospel to get out to those who seek Him. Despite a significant shift in values and morals, we know our faith will **not be shaken** as we are rooted in the firm foundation of our Lord Jesus Christ—the author and finisher of our faith.
