They even put masks again as a requirement outside if you're near another person! (we DO NOT comply with that under any circumstance! So unhealthy for you!) Below are pictures of the final development phase for Maranatha Farms that we built with YOUR help in Lagos, Nigeria. Something very strange happened to Frank the project manager. We know it was the enemy attempting to kill and destroy. The day he left to order the grasscutters for the farm, his wife fell extremely ill of typhoid fever and malaria. In Nigeria you have to prepay all hospital visits to get help, so we did this for him and literally saved her life! She was at huge risk of losing her life to this fever! She was in the hospital for 4 days with intensive IV of antibiotics. We did have to use some of the money we had set aside to buy an electric generator they needed for the farm to bring water to the animals, but we had to literally save her life. We are believing God for a full redemption of this money so they can bring water through a pump and hose to take care of the grasscutters rather than going to the river, which is extremely hard work. The final news we would like to share is that things are going well with Nicolas' job. He has to travel to Switzerland for the company to sell luxury furniture to some of the wealthiest people in the world. The good news is that the whole way up he is in the car with different co-workers (architects, designers, CEO, etc.) and each time he gets HOURS to share the Gospel with them. Most of them come from highly educated and wealthy backgrounds and for many of them it is the first time they have intelligent yet SIMPLE understanding of theology, the Cross, Jesus the PERSON, etc. For some of his co-workers he's become almost like their private counselor LOL. Because so many of them come to him with their problems and God gives him wisdom to help. He has abounding opportunities to share. It is another reason why we like him in the marketplace here. He stays connected to society, and of course we need that provision to be able to live here with 5 children. Although the restrictions on the non-vaccinated just got stricter here, we do not intend to leave for any reason. We know God is asking us to stay. Right now, if you are not vaccinated the only places you can access are the supermarket, the pharmacy, and some church services. That's it! You cannot get into the bank, post office, shoe or clothing stores, coffee shops, restaurants, pretty much anywhere. We are a pretty decent size army of people resisting it, but we are not big enough yet. However, there are many shop owners standing against discrimination!

I (Leia) stay busy teaching English and a cognitive program each week in our kids' homeschool co-op. One of the parents said to me this week, "when can I come over and talk about Jesus with you and your husband"? WOW! People are hungry and curious about who this Jesus is! Also, this month I'm walking through a counseling course to get a lower-level type of certification to be a counselor, as well as hoping to finish by March a course on neurological studies to become an Equipping Minds therapist.
